St. Mary's School Anti-Bullying Policy

Introduction

St. Mary's Catholic School holds the truth that all people are created in the image and likeness of God. Each person is blessed with his or her own talents and gifts. It is a goal for our school to recognize, appreciate, and celebrate diversity in all.

The school strives to establish an environment where all members feel safe, secure, and loved. We believe that we are called to reflect the love of Jesus Christ in the manner in which we interact with others. Members of our school community are called to treat one another with dignity and respect at all times.

Purpose

Bullying, harassment, or intimidation against others is contrary to a Christ centered community. Therefore, St. Mary's School has established the following procedures for prevention, intervention, and response to bullying behaviors.

Policy Statement

Bullying in any form will not be tolerated at St. Mary's School. Members of the school community engaging in these behaviors are subject to disciplinary action. Bullying is contrary to the values of St. Mary's School and contrary to Illinois State law. The standards of this Policy require the efforts and support of all students, parents, families, faculty, and staff of St. Mary's School.

Definition

It is important to understand the difference between bullying and children's development of appropriate social interaction. Not all negative social behaviors can be classified as bullying. Acceptable social skills and behaviors are learned through a process, are age appropriate, and are learned through the examples set by the adults in their lives. We do not see bullying as an isolated incident, disagreements, or not forming close friendships. Our definition of bullying includes, but is not limited to the following:

"A person is bullied when he or she is exposed, repeatedly and over time, to negative actions on the part of one or more persons, and he or she has difficulty defending himself or herself."

- 1. Bullying is deliberate, sustained, and unprovoked.
- 2. It is aggressive behavior that involves unwanted negative actions.
- 3. It involves a pattern of behavior repeated over time.
- 4. Bullying involves an imbalance of power or strength.

Bullying can be and include the following:

Verbal or written — harassment, intimidation, teasing, name calling, inappropriate sexual comments, sexual harassment, sexual violence, public humiliation, taunting, retaliation, threatening to cause harm, lies, and false rumors

Social exclusion or isolation – leaving someone out on purpose, embarrassing someone in public, telling others not to be friends with someone

Physical – physical violence, intimidation, hitting, kicking, punching, spitting, tripping, pushing, taking things, rude gestures, public humiliation, retaliation, theft, destruction of property

Threatening - intimidating behaviors, verbal threats, stalking

Cyber – through technology, includes but not limited to the following: writing, signs, signals, images, sound, data, texting, emails, instant messages, blogs, postings on social media

The school may take disciplinary action for instances involving bullying both on and off school grounds and within school hours or outside of school hours.

In addition, St. Mary's School follows the definition outlined by the State of Illinois.

Definition of Bullying by State of Illinois

Illinois anti-bullying laws include the following definitions of bullying and cyberbullying:

- "Bullying" includes "cyber-bullying" and means any severe or pervasive physical or verbal act or conduct, including communications made in writing or electronically, directed toward a student or students that has or can be reasonably predicted to have the effect of one or more of the following:
- (1) placing the student or students in reasonable fear of harm to the student's or students' person or property;
- (2) causing a substantially detrimental effect on the student's or students' physical or mental health;
- (3) substantially interfering with the student's or students' academic performance; or
- (4) substantially interfering with the student's or students' ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities, or privileges provided by a school.
- "Bullying", as defined in this subsection (b), may take various forms, including without limitation one or more of the following: harassment, threats, intimidation, stalking, physical violence, sexual harassment, sexual violence, theft, public humiliation, destruction of property, or retaliation for asserting or alleging an act of bullying. This list is meant to be illustrative and non-exhaustive.
- "Cyber-bullying" means bullying through the use of technology or any electronic communication, including without limitation any transfer of signs, signals, writing, images, sounds, data, or intelligence of any nature transmitted in whole or in part by a wire, radio, electromagnetic system, photoelectronic system, or photo-optical system, including without limitation electronic mail, Internet communications, instant messages, or facsimile communications. "Cyber-bullying" includes the creation of a webpage or weblog in which the creator assumes the identity of another person or the knowing impersonation of another person as the author of posted content or messages if the

creation or impersonation creates any of the effects enumerated in the definition of bullying in this Section. "Cyber-bullying" also includes the distribution by electronic means of a communication to more than one person or the posting of material on an electronic medium that may be accessed by one or more persons if the distribution or posting creates any of the effects enumerated in the definition of bullying in this Section.

Prevention and Education

Bullying prevention starts with a clear understanding and clear communication of the policy and procedures. Learning to distinguish the difference between normal social development, negative social behaviors and actual bullying is imperative to the process.

School Responsibilities:

- 1. The school will provide education regarding prevention and responses to bullying, harassment, and intimidation to all students in grades kindergarten through grade 8 through religion classes, health classes, special presentations, assemblies, etc.
- 2. The faculty and staff will receive professional development education and/or resources on prevention and responses to bullying, harassment, and intimidation.
- 3. The faculty and staff will remain alert to signs of bullying and report incidents to the teacher in charge and principal.
- 4. Faculty and/or principal will notify parents of both parties when a bullying incident has been substantiated.

Student Responsibilities:

- 1. Students will treat others with respect and dignity and in line with the values, attitudes, and teachings of the Catholic Church.
- 2. Students will report incidents of bullying or concerns regarding bullying.
- 3. Students will stand up when possible for any person being bullied.

Parent Responsibilities:

- 1. Parents will report immediate concerns of bullying to the appropriate teacher.
- 2. Parents will support the school's policy and procedures regarding bullying.
- 3. Parents will encourage their child/children not to engage in bullying behaviors.

Reporting Procedures

Students, parents, faculty and staff of St. Mary's Catholic School have the right and responsibility to report incidents of bullying. The goal is to maintain a sound, secure learning environment in which all members feel accepted, validated, and safe. Incidents of bullying and other inappropriate social behaviors are not always witnessed by school administration or teachers. In order to intervene and address the situation, school personnel must be informed.

- 1. Students are encouraged to report bullying concerns to their classroom teacher or other trusted school personnel. They may do this verbally or by filing a written bullying report form.
- Parents are encouraged to report their concerns directly to the faculty or administration. This can be done verbally or through a written notification. Concerns should be reported promptly. It is difficult to investigate situations that occurred weeks in the past.
- 3. Teachers and staff will report all bullying incidents and concerns through either their own observation or from reports from others.
- 4. School administration will maintain records of all reports filed during the school year.
- 5. Reporting may also be done anonymously by calling the school office or submitting a form without indicating names.

Intervention

- All staff will watch for early signs of distress.
- The school will respond promptly and seriously to reports of bullying.
- The school will conduct a thorough investigation of a reported incident.
- Upon review and investigation of the alleged bullying incident, the school will handle the incident in a manner that will assist in maintaining a safe environment and prevent negative social behavior or bullying from recurring.
- The school will notify the parents/guardians of the parties involved in the incident.

Consequences/Disciplinary Action

The following list of consequences will be applied to incidents involving bullying. Individual circumstances warrant the appropriate path of consequences. Disciplinary actions include but are not limited to those listed below. The goal is to stop the behavior and assist the child in learning appropriate social interactions thus creating a safe, secure environment.

Warning
Verbal Reprimand
Parent/Guardian Notification
Loss of privilege
Detention
Parent Conference
Conference with parish priest
In-school suspension
Out of school suspension
Referral to counselor
Behavior Management Program

Retaliation Against Persons Reporting Bullying

St. Mary's School prohibits any reprisal or retaliation against any person who reports an act of bullying. Consequences will include but not limited to the following: conference, parent/guardian notification, detention, in-school suspension, counseling.

Conclusion

The ultimate goal is to assist all students to work together in a loving cooperative spirit. We will be kind, compassionate, and forgiving in working with all students and families.
